I have been carrying out regular patrols of the area with the DVLA. This has resulted in fifty two cars being clamped in the past two months for no current tax disc. Please report any suspected abandoned vehicle to me on my voicemail, call 0845 60 70 999 and leave a message on my voicemail 21908.



Now that the new school year has started, please park safely and considerately near schools. Do not park on the 'KEEP CLEAR – SCHOOL ENTRANCE' zig zag markings. I will be patrolling school sites at peak times, drivers found causing an obstruction could be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN).

Harmans Drive (south end of Estcots Drive) is experiencing high levels of anti social behaviour. This has included dangerous driving by riders of motorcycles and scooters.

Under the Police Reform Act the police have new powers to seize motor vehicles which are causing alarm, distress or annoyance to members of the public. Similar powers now exist for offences of no licence/no insurance under the

Serious Organised Crime and Police Act 2005. Repeat offenders should be warned that they may have their vehicles taken from them. The cost to remove these will be over £100, otherwise they may be destroyed.

Please be aware of the impact that such behaviour can have on residents. Respect resident's right to a peaceful and safe neighbourhood. Police will patrol this area and deal with any offenders in a positive manner.



Underage drinking and its ramifications are of great concern to the whole community. Many offences (such as criminal damage and assault) are committed when persons are under the influence of alcohol.

Police are targeting those who are responsible for supplying alcohol to underage persons. It is a criminal offence to supply alcohol to an under eighteen year old. Offenders could be fined up to £5000.

Parents and guardians have a responsibility to be aware of where their children are and what they are doing. Are your children obtaining alcohol from the family home? Make your children aware of the impact alcohol can have on their actions and the possible intervention by Police.
